If you are constructing a new building, filing for a municipal office, needing a liquor license, registering to vote, or just have a general question and aren't sure where to start, chances are you'll be assisted by City Clerk Robin Kincaid.

As the custodian of official records for the City of Riverside, Robin's duties are as varied as her smile is wide. She is the keeper of the City Seal, serves as the election authority, registers new voters, and administers oaths of office. Robin also serves as Secretary to the Board, handles scheduling events for each member, and is responsible for posting and preparing for public meetings, as well as procuring necessary signatures on ordinances, resolutions, contracts, then ensuring all documents are complete. Robin supports the City Administrator and the Mayor too — along with any other City staff member who needs assistance.

# Horizons Development Update

*Growth continues at sizzling pace*

There are two constants with a Riverside summer: hot temperatures and brisk construction in Horizons Business Park. Riverside's



location and pro-business climate continue to attract interest, as additions wrap up on 200,000 sq. ft. of additional space at Yanfeng and Premium Waters facilities. U.S. Farathane is completing a 220,000 sq. ft. buildout in Horizons Spec IV, with operations set to start this fall. And Seattle Fish is constructing a new 30,000 sq. ft. distribution facility that will allow efficient delivery of fresh seafood to area restaurants and stores beginning in the late fall.

Demand for space in Horizons is so great that two speculative buildings are under construction. On the west side of

Horizons Parkway, the 245,000 sq. ft. Riverside Logistics Centre is being built on the former site of Fleming Babcock, and will be ready for tenants in April 2016. On the east side of Horizons Parkway, NorthPoint Development is constructing Horizons Spec V. The 491,000 sq. ft. facility is the largest building in Riverside, and will be ready for occupancy in January 2016.


## Food Truck Court Serves up Variety

New dining options rolled into Riverside during Food Truck Friday on August 14 at the new Food Truck Court, located in Horizons Business Park west of Horizons Parkway and 39th Street.

The City developed the court in response to workers who love the local dining spots but wanted more choices for lunch. Constructed from asphalt millings and lined with large stones that were spoils from the construction of the canals along Horizons Parkway, the 12,000 sq. ft. hard-surfaced court was economically and sustainably built.
